Our Curriculum

This section is focused on our Curriculum and provides an overview of the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Framework and the Curriculum offer for children in Years 1 to 6.

The Curriculum is all the planned activities that the school organises in order to promote learning, personal growth and development.

It includes not only the formal requirements of the National Curriculum, but also the range of additional opportunities that the school organises in order to enrich the experiences of our children. This includes an ever growing range of 'Enjoyment and Enrichment' opportunities available to our children across all year groups.

Our Curriculum also includes the social aspects imperative for life long learning. The Rights Respecting School Award and Investing In Children Award demonstrates the importance of children having high expectations of behaviour and tolerance towards each other. Framwellgate Moor Primary School was awarded 'Outstanding' from Ofsted in December 2012. The school continues to maintain high standards believing that education has to continually improve.

Framwellgate Moor Primary School aims to maximise social and academic potential for every pupil on their exciting school journey.

Special Educational Needs & Disabilities (SEND)

All pupils follow the National Curriculum at a level and a pace that is appropriate to their abilities. Our SEND philosophy places SEND children at the heart of personalised learning and our curriculum is tailored to meet individual pupils needs.

At times and when it is felt appropriate, modifications to the curriculum may be implemented. To successfully match pupil ability to the curriculum Framwellgate Moor Primary School remain committed to:

- A range of teaching and learning styles
- Differentiated learning materials
- Access to ICT and Technology
- Additional in class support
- Additional out of class support
- Enrichment and Enjoyment opportunities to stimulate and motivate learning
- Flexible groupings - including small group support work
- An innovative and supportive curriculum
- The appropriate use of rewards and sanctions
- A broad range of extra-curricular activities, including homework club, one to one support and booster/extension sessions
- Assessment procedures that emphasise pupils' strengths and achievements
- Applications during national testing at Key Stage 2 to obtain access arrangements as appropriate

SEND - Finance

The school funding formula is generated to include financial provision to specifically support pupils individual special needs.

This funding is prioritised to tailor make learning to ensure small steps of progress are continually made by all SEN learners.

At Framwellgate Moor Primary school, for those pupils with High Needs, Costed Provision Maps are created with detailed evidence of supporting resources provided in school. This builds a portfolio of the progress each child makes and additional funding and financial support can be allocated for from the Local Authority. In September 2022, this system will change to a Banding approach and we will adapt our policies and procedures accordingly.

Detailed assessments and target tracking ensure that all learners achieve and make progress at Framwellgate Moor Primary School.

SEN Provision - Our Local Offer

Statement of Intent for Supporting Equality

At Framwellgate Moor Primary School we are committed to equality. We aim for every pupil to fulfil their potential no matter what his/her background or personal circumstances.

How we support SEN

We understand that children learn and develop in different ways. Teachers and teaching assistants recognise this and use different teaching styles, resources and plan different levels of work in the classroom to cater for the various ways children learn. However, many children, at some time in their school life, need extra help.

How do we identify and assess children with SEN?

A special educational need can be a number of different things. For example, a child may be having problems with reading, number work or emotional difficulties, which can be helped by putting extra support in at school and by working in partnership with parents. It may also be due to a disability which makes it harder for a child to use the same educational facilities that the school provides for the majority of children. For some children this may be a temporary difficulty, while others may have a long term need for special help.

Pastoral Medical and Social Support

At Framwellgate Moor Primary School we consult with a wide range of agencies and partnerships to ensure the pastoral, medical and social needs of SEND children are met.

How we consult with our SEN pupils

Ensuring that all children attending Framwellgate Moor Primary School receive provision that maximises their enjoyment and achievement is central to all we offer.

SEND - Transition

At Framwellgate Moor Primary School we recognise how important a successful transition is to our pupils with additional needs.

We work in partnership with our feeder secondary schools to provide an enhanced level of transition for those who we feel would benefit from this. This may take the form of additional visits for pupils, one to one / small group working with secondary school staff or pupil mentoring from secondary schools.

The period of transition depends on the individual needs of the pupil. If it is felt appropriate secondary school colleagues will attend Annual Reviews to meet the current class teacher, parents and most importantly the pupil. We have found this strategy particularly useful in easing any worries or concerns parents and pupils may have. We are particularly keen to involve parents/carers as much as possible in their child's transition to secondary school. School staff will take opportunities to work alongside parents/carers to visit secondary schools in advance of secondary placement applications being submitted to the Local Authority.

This ensures parents/carers can make the most informed placement decision for their child. When a secondary school has been allocated to the child, parents are fully involved and consulted at all stages of the transition process.

Transition from each Year Group is supported so that the children have met with their new teachers and are familiar with the new classroom environment and organisation.

New starters for Reception children are provided with the following opportunities:

- Parent Open Information Event
- Children's visits to Reception class in the Summer Term
- Pupils and Parents invited for School Lunch

At Framwellgate Moor Primary School we have a flexible approach and additional visit opportunities or multi-agency meetings can be organised if required.

The National Award for SEN Co-ordinator was achieved by Miss Wilkinson in 2011. This role supports all families in the transition for all SEN pupils working closely with multi-agencies and partnerships to ensure that their learning journey is a happy and successful one. SEND - Compliments & Complaints
